Resource Spotlight: SCOPUS Free Trial through Jan. 31

Through **January 31**, you can explore [SCOPUS](#), a large abstract and citation database of peer-reviewed research literature from Elsevier. It includes more than 20,000 peer-reviewed journals (including 2,800 gold open access titles), 6.5 million conference papers, more than 25 million patents and more, in the fields of mathematics, engineering, technology, health and medicine, social sciences, and arts and humanities. Features include "citation tracker" to track citations over time and "author evaluator" to analyze an author's publishing output.

If you are working with staff promotions or candidate reviews, the Technical Library provides Citation Search Reports, which include a full search in Web of Science (and can include Google Scholar and Total

From 11:30-12:30 learn how to **Search the Chemistry Literature** with Mary Frances Lembo, and from 12:30-1:30, Justin Day will lead a class in **Structure Searching**, which provides access to literature, suppliers and property information. The last 30 minutes of each class will be for hands-on experience in performing your own searches with a research librarian available to answer questions. Computers will be available, or you can bring your laptop. You will need a SciFinder account to search on your own. Information Issues & News: Researcher Identifiers/ORCID

Do you have a **ResearcherID**, or an **ORCID**? Are all of your publications attached to it? These identifiers are valuable to make sure all of your publications are appropriately linked to you. If your name is unusual, or you have always published with exactly the same name, this is less critical, but still useful. Having your publications linked to your personal ORCID makes generating a current (and accurate) publications list much more efficient, and all future articles will be linked automatically. We are just beginning to work with authors at the Lab to get ORCIDs established and publications linked.
