Resource Spotlight: ExPub is now ToxPlanet; New Web of Science feature (Saving Marked Lists)

[ToxPlanet](#) (formerly ExPub) contains millions of chemical information documents covering over 410,000 unique substances and is available courtesy of the [Technical Library](#). In addition to CHRIS, IRIS, and RTECS, it includes hard-to-find content from the EPA, the National Toxicology Program, the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry, the CPS&Q (formerly the European Chemical Bureau), the US DoD and many others including content from around the world. A new feature is complimentary access to PoisonEXPERT, your gateway to TOXINZ, a database that offers recommendations on the management of chronic and acute exposures to hazardous substances. If relevant to your search, PoisonEXPERT will appear as an active tab on your search page and provide access to TOXINZ content.

Web of Science has just added a “**Save Marked List**” feature, and they are offering a webinar about how to use it. Go to their [training website](#) to register for this and other sessions, including Basic Search, Benchmarking & Analytics, and EndNote for WoS Users. And remember that you can always call the Technical Library for help with any of our digital resources, or check out other online training options—many have their own YouTube channels as well as periodic live webinars.

Service Spotlight: Free ILL for FY16; Nature Publishing Group webinar


Interlibrary Loan, the service that provides articles and books from outside libraries, is free for FY2016. Journal articles and books not available through the Technical Library can be requested through the library [online form](#), [email](#) or from the embedded ILL Request form on the Primo search results page (click ‘Sign-in’ in the upper right

corner of the [Primo home page](#) to activate this feature). About 97 percent of requests are filled within three business days, with the majority of requested items delivered in electronic format. If you need a document in a hurry, requests will be sent to commercial providers; a WP# will be required for these charges. These requests are usually filled within hours.

ORCID@PNNL: What's an ORCID?...


As we begin the process of introducing ORCIDs at PNNL, some background:



The ORCID ID
<http://orcid.org/0000-0002-2123-6317>

- 16-digit number
- Expressed as an HTTP URI
- Compatible with ISO 277729 standard
- Last character is a checksum (ISO/IEC 7064:2006, MOD 11,2)

[ORCID](#) (the organization) arose from a 2009 meeting of scientific publishers and other stakeholders to address the large (and expanding) issue of name disambiguation. At PNNL, publication metrics are important, and thus getting the right authors with the right papers is critical. But ORCID's value is not just about authorship: it provides a transparent method of linking research activities and outputs to a single identifier.



ORCID Mission

ORCID is an **international, interdisciplinary, open, and not-for-profit** organization created for the benefit of all stakeholders, including **research organizations, research funders, organizations, publishers, and researchers**

We aim to transform the research ecosystem by providing a **registry of persistent unique identifiers for researchers and scholars** and **automating linkages to research objects** such as publications, grants, and patents.
