Discover worldwide comprehensive coverage of research literature in the biological and biomedical sciences from 1969 to present. Subject areas include cell biology, experimental medicine, microbiology, radiation biology, veterinary science, zoology and much more. **Access is limited to PNNL staff and at the user stations only.**

Find scientific and technical information from any of ten different databases with this single interface. Databases include *ASFA: Aquatic Sciences and Fisheries Abstracts*, *BioOne*, *Corrosion Abstracts*, *GeoRef METADEX*, *Oceanic Abstracts*, *Pollution Abstracts*, *Toxicology Abstracts*, and *Water Resources Abstracts*. Computing Reviews: <http://www.reviews.com/>

Computing Reviews provide access to current research, theory and applications in all sub-disciplines of computing. The database compiles expert, unbiased critical reviews of current publications of note and provides an overview of developments in computing. Instructions for setting up alerts are available at http://www.reviews.com/help/help_help.cfm?helptext_id=3. **Access is limited to PNNL staff and at the user stations only.**

This database contains web-based versions of the Federal Register, Code of Federal Regulations, the U.S. Code, and selected state codes and statutes. Set up email notification of changes to state and federal regulations. The Hanford Technical Library subscribes to thousands of electronic journals. Scan the contents of journals in your field to track emerging trends. Many publishers of electronic journals offer email notification services even if the library doesn't have a subscription. Check individual titles for instructions.

Three databases are available - *Compendex*, *Inspec*, and *NTIS*. *Compendex* includes topics in chemical and process engineering, computers and data processing, applied physics, electronics and communication, civil engineering, and mechanical engineering. *Inspec* covers the fields of electrical engineering, computer science, control engineering, and physics. *NTIS* supplies U.S. government-sponsored research and worldwide scientific, technical, engineering, and business-related information.

Click on the email alert button on the right side of the screen to access two alerting options. Select tables of contents of your favorite IEEE transactions and magazines and have the tables of contents forwarded to you upon publication. MicroPatent Database: <http://www.micropat.com/cgi-bin/easylogin>

Search the full text of US, European, Patent Cooperation Treaty (WO), Great Britain, and German patent records as well as the front page of Japanese documents. Create an alert and review patent literature on new inventions by keyword, inventor or patent assignee. A tip sheet with instructions is available at <https://library.pnl.gov/tipsheet/micropat.pdf>. **Access is limited to PNNL staff only.**

Access a large online repository of citations, abstracts and full-text content to over 3500 newspapers, magazines, journals and trade publications. Information about setting up topic and publication alerts is located at <http://proquest.umi.com/i-std/en/pri/alerts/alerts.htm>.

ScienceDirect offers more than a quarter of the world's scientific, medical and technical information online and provides full-text access to over 1,900 journal titles. Set up an account to personalize your quick links, alerts, and more.

This multidisciplinary database includes peer reviewed articles from a broad range of scientific and technical journals. Use the Save History menu to set up a topic alert or an RSS feed to track new scientific and technical literature in your field.

Monitor companies, industries, and news in selected regions and markets. Set up email alerts or RSS feeds from business journals published throughout the United States. You must register for email the alerting service, but there is no charge.

This free service monitors any webpage for changes and sends you email when the page is updated.

Google News Alerts: <http://www.google.com/newsalerts>

Receive a list of news articles by e-mail free of charge. This is very simple to set up and the results are taken from a large number of news sources.

Infominder: <http://www.infominder.com/webminder/index.jsp>

This fee-based service enables users to track web sites and receive e-mail notification when content changes in text, HTML, or digest format. Notifications can also be sent to multiple users and delivery can be scheduled anywhere from hourly to monthly.

Elsevier Science offers a free e-mail alerting service for titles and abstracts of Elsevier articles related to nano science and technology.

NEWSBridge: <http://libraryweb.pnl.gov/newsbridge/>

This free news service produced by the Hanford Technical Library brings you the latest headlines and links to news articles that mention PNNL, Hanford, other DOE labs, science and technology policy and developments, and other areas of interest.

TracerLock: <http://www.tracerlock.com/>

This fee-based service stores your Internet searches; monitors search engines results, and notifies you via email when a new instance of your search is found.

TrackEngine: <http://www.trackengine.com/servlets/com.nexlabs.trackengine.ui.Login>

This database allows you to track up to five Web pages or topic searches and notifies you via email when new information is found. Registration is required, but the service is free.

TVEyes: <http://www.tveyes.com>

This service monitors television broadcasts and notifies you via email when your selected keywords (up to three) are spoken on television. This is a fee based service.

WatchThatPage: <http://www.watchthatpage.com/>

Automatically collect new information from your favorite Internet pages with this free service. Select pages to monitor and WatchThatPage will find changes and collect all new content for you. The new information is presented to you in an email and/or a personal web page.

This free service allows you to monitor news by keyword or topic area. The service requires registration and news alerts are sent by email.
